<b>POLICIES</b>	
<b>Attendance policy</b>	According to the legal framework of Ukraine in the field of higher education, students of higher medical educational institutions do not have the right to freely attend lectures and practical classes. If a student misses a practical lesson for a good reason, then in the presence of a permit, the topic is worked out without working time on Tuesdays every week at 05.30-06.50 p.m., Sumy State University, building "M", room 409, 410, 414. If a student misses a class for a disrespectful reason (paid work), then in the presence of a permit, the time and topic of the class are worked out on Tuesdays of each week at 05.30-06.50 p.m., Sumy State University, building "M", room 409, 410, 414.

<p><b>Assessment policy</b></p>	<p>Grade in the discipline is defined as the sum of points for current educational activities (not less than 72) and points for the final module control (not less than 48). The number of points for current activities is calculated by the formula <math>120 \times \frac{\text{arithmetic mean of student success in a 4-point grading system}}{5}</math>. The final module control is conducted at the end of the semester in the form of a written test, with a score of "5" corresponds to 80 points, "4" - 64 points, "3" - 48 points, "2" - 0 points. In case of unsatisfactory result for the final module control, the student has the right to retake the test. Students who fail to take the test without good reason are considered to have received an unsatisfactory grade. The student's refusal to perform the final modular task is certified as an unsatisfactory answer.</p>
<p><b>Deadlines and course retake policy</b></p>	<p>The student has the right to 2 attempts to rearrange the differential test in the discipline, the time of rearrangement is agreed with the teacher. During the re-assembly the student passes: testing and gives a written answer to two theoretical questions of the module.</p>
<p><b>Assessment appeals policy</b></p>	<p>The results of the module and semester assessment are subject to appeal. A student must lodge an appeal to the director/dean on the day of certification or after announcing the results, but no later than the next working day. The appeal commission is established by the director/dean's order. The appeal commission's decision may change the grade in case of violations revealed during the attestation.</p>
<p><b>Academic integrity policy</b></p>	<p>Participants must complete all tasks according to the course requirements independently. Participants are not allowed to cheat during the written module or summative test. The assignments should not contain plagiarism, facts of fabrication, falsification, cheating. Manifestations of other types of academic dishonesty determined by the Academic Integrity policy are also unacceptable. If a teacher reveals violations of academic integrity by students during the course, the former have the right to take one of the following actions: - to reduce points by up to 40% for practical assignments; - to give recommendations for improving and resubmitting mandatory homework assignments with the reduction of points by up to 25%; - to not accept mandatory homework assignments without the right to resubmit; - set a date for retaking the written module or the summative test with a reduction of points by up to 15%; - to not allow to retake the written module or the summative test.</p>
